It went well and KCL took care of the logistics of bringing the invited guests through funding from ASA-UK. Other partners such as Maastricht University (UM), NL also took part and delivered the sessions for the health cluster.</p>

Identify the main challenges identified by CHAMPIONS in terms of publishing their academic research 3. Establish networks with other partners with the view of supporting future publications 4. <p>Activities carried out:</p>	<p>Subsequent to the writing workshop which took place in Benguela, for the workshops in Luanda during the international conference, we took on board some of the comments and suggestions and recognised that it would be helpful if we ran different sessions according to different streams. Therefore, in Luanda there were separate sessions organised for different streams such as Social Sciences, Health Sciences and Economics. These proved to be more successful as participants were able to focus on their disciplines and on writing for articles which were specific to their disciplines. The groups were smaller and the dialogue more fruitful.</p>
<p>Workshop Achievements</p>	<p>There was enthusiasm to do collaborations between colleagues from different partner institutions and that was a very positive outcome of these workshops.</p>



<p>Conclusion / Recommendations</p>	<p>There were challenges in terms of securing appropriate rooms to run these sessions and in terms of some of the CHAMPIONS who did not want to miss out on some of the panels, which were running in parallel. We have also taken these concerns on board and will implement changes for future conferences and workshops.</p>
